As you know attendance and punctuality are very important to help ensure that your child makes the best progress they can at school. This week we have an excellent attendance figure of 98.3% and everyone has been punctual which means the school day can get off to a prompt and efficient start. Many thanks.

Please remember to phone the school office before 10am (earlier if possible) if your child is going to be absent and to follow -up absence by completing the form in the school porch. Holidays and non-urgent medical/dental appointments should be avoided during school time. I am unable to authorise requests for holidays due to legal regulations (except in exceptional cir-

cumstances) therefore any absence would be recorded as unauthorised.

Teaching staff supervise the beginning of the school day (from 8.40am). Once you have brought your child to school we request that you leave the school playground so that duty teachers can supervise the children easily. At the end of the day please avoid coming into the school grounds before 3pm as lessons are often still going on outdoors, Dogs are not allowed within the school grounds and we also request that mobile phones and other electronic devices are not used within the school grounds.
