

This Friday 7th October we will be supporting the annual Cafod Harvest Fast Appeal. The theme this year is "Brighten up this Harvest." In school this week, children will learn about helping to build a brighter world and during this, the Year of Mercy, will put into action an act of mercy: to "Feed the Hungry."

This year's appeal supports families in Bolivia, South America. The children will learn more about the appeal from our local CAFOD volunteer Margaret Hodgson (whose father, Jim, was the first headteacher of St Paul's) and how money raised will support hungry children in Bolivia; if you would like further information then you can find it on the CAFOD website. This Friday is a non-uniform day and children can dress in as many bright colours as possible (please, no football strips). Children can bring in a donation to the charity if they wish; we have boxes like the ones above and aim to fill as many as possible with coins—this appeal will remain open until the half term holiday so please do take the opportunity to donate if you would like to. Donations will be collected each day.

October is traditionally a month to honour Our Lady, Mary the mother of Jesus. Each Friday during October children will be invited to pray the traditional "Hail Mary" prayer and listen to a Bible story about Mary. Children will be encouraged to share some of her many gifts—love, gentleness, patience, kindness, faithfulness and joy - with others. The prayer group will gather at 8.40am. To ensure the safety and well being of our pupils, could you please ensure that children do not ride bikes or scooters within the school grounds. Year 1 and 2 pupils will be supervised by 2 members of school staff on a morning from **8.40am**. Please do not come into the playground before **8.30am**, and once the duty teachers are on the playground we politely ask that adults leave the playground. The car park should not be used by anyone dropping off or picking up children and please avoid using the lane which is a major area of congestion.

To aim to make our school environment safer, we are supporting the "Living Streets" initiative which is encouraging children and their families to walk to school. Although this is often difficult to manage due to family circumstances, we are asking you to think about perhaps doing this once a week. The children are keeping a record of how they travel to school and will be rewarded with a badge each month if they have managed, at least once a week, to walk or "walk and stride" (this involves parking a short walk away from school and walking part of the journey) to school. They have been discussing how walking to school can improve their fitness and well-being, as well as making our school environment a safer place.
