



ATTENDANCE AND SAFEGUARDING

Thank you for your continued support with ensuring that children attend school every day and on time. Our current school attendance since September is: 96% It would be good to see this rise to 97% - so please do try to ensure that your child is at school every day.

23 of our pupils have had 100% attendance since the beginning of the school year —well done children. Attendance so far this term is reported below

Year 1: 98.5% Year 2: 98.5%

Year 3: 97.5%

Year 4: 92.5% Year 5: 97.5%

Year 6: 99%





Please continue to report absence due to illness by 10am on the first day of absence. This should be done by phoning the school office. Requests for leave of absence during term time are to be made; forms are available in the porch. Holidays taken during term time should be avoided. Holidays can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. The school has a duty to monitor attendance and punctuality and the school attendance officer from the Local Authority also monitors attendance. National school attendance is 96% and as a school it is our aim to be above this national target—thank you for your support.

It is also really important that your child is at school by 8.50am. We appreciate your support to ensure that your child is not late for school as this disrupts the start of the school day. At the end of the school day, we encourage children to leave the school safely. It is a busy time of day so please ensure that your child is with you or the adult collecting them. Thank you for supporting this.

To ensure that our school premise and surrounding area is a safe place to be please ensure that scooters and bikes are not mounted whilst inside the school grounds. Please park considerately and safely around school and continue to support our "Walk to School" campaign. Many thanks.

SUNNY DAYS

As the weather hopefully continues to improve please ensure that your child is adequately prepared for sunny days! Children are encouraged to bring a sun hat or cap to school to wear outside. For health and safety reasons sunglasses are not encouraged. Please apply sun cream before your child comes to school; do not send sun cream into school. As always, children should have a water bottle in school filled with fresh water—no juice or flavoured water please. They should take their water bottle home at the end of each day.
