Year 6 Autumn Newsletter

Welcome back to a new school year. We hope you all had a very enjoyable and relaxing holiday.

Thank you for your support in making the beginning of the school year run so smoothly and calmly. The children have settled in well and appear keen and eager to learn!

English

Much of our English work in Year 6 is linked to our topics. Our first topic this term is the 'Victorians' and we will use this fascinating area of history as a basis for our writing.

Throughout the year, there will be a huge focus on spelling, punctuation and grammar, where the children will be expected to apply their learning across all curriculum areas, including their homework.

During this term our whole class reading books will be 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty and 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens. Both of these books link to our 'Victorian' topic work. The children have weekly spellings to learn (please find them on the homework menu). Spellings will be tested each Friday.

In reading we will focus on how to make deductions from our reading beyond what is simply written in black and white. To help your child with their reading at home there are some things you can do.

I Hear your child read as often as possible.

I Talk about the text with them. What is happening and why?

Help your child to make meaningful comments giving their opinion on what they have read.

Do skimming and scanning exercises. Choose two pages and make up a couple of questions. Then encourage your child to scan through looking for key words that might help find the answer.

RE

St. Paul's R.C Primary continues to follow the RE scheme, 'Come and See'. The three topics that the children will be learning about this term are:

- Loving

- Vocation and Commitment

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Maths

In Mathematics, the children will develop and build upon their skills from Y5.

We will be exploring place value, and we will be moving onto standard written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Later in the term we will focus on fractions and position and direction. The children will also be encouraged to learn their multiplication tables up to 12×12 and related division facts. Pupils may wish to practise these crucial skills using the following web links as well as ensuring that they regularly participate in <u>Times Tables Rock Star</u> <u>practise.</u>

Science

This half term the children will be learning about Light and how the eye processes light. In the next half term, children will be exploring electricity and circuits.

Geography / History

In history this term we will be exploring life in Victorian Britain. Through this topic the children will also learn more about the industrial revolution, railways, mining and famous Victorians. This is a fantastic topic which is always thoroughly enjoyed by the pupils.

French

The children will continue to have a weekly French lesson, where they will learn more about the French language and culture.

Computing

The children will start with an exciting unit on developing their programming skills.

Art & DT

In art lessons, the children will be exploring the work of many famous Victorian artists including William Morris, Charles Rennie Mackintosh and Turner.

In DT the children will compare the diet of a modern school child to that of a Victorian school child. They will also have the opportunity to make some gruel and sample some traditional Victorian dishes.

Later in the term the children will be learning about structures and designing bridges linked to the work of the Victorian engineer Isambard Kingdom Brunel.

Music

We are very lucky to have Mr Harbisher from Tees Valley Music to teach us music this term. We will be learning to play the recorder as well as learning lots of Victorian songs linked to our topic.

PE

Class 6 will have their P.E sessions once in the week with the class teacher and each Friday morning with Mr. Sheahan. Please make sure your child has their P.E kit available for the duration of the week in school and that it is clearly labelled with their name.
