

Year 4's Newsletter Autumn Term 2019



Welcome back to you all!

I hope that you have all had a wonderful summer and that your children are glad to be back. We have had a fantastic first week back at school!

English

We will be studying a range of text types throughout the term including non chronological reports, fictional novels and poetry as well as a range of extended writing linked to our WWII topic. We will develop our use of punctuation and sentence structure and write both short and extended pieces. The curriculum places a real emphasis on Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG) and so many of our starter activities will focus on consolidating and extending our grammatical knowledge. In terms of reading, the children will be % partaking in a number of whole class reading based activities throughout the week ranging from structured reading comprehension % sessions, newspapers, activities and library time.

R.E.

This term we will be studying three themes: Domestic Church (People), Reconciliation (Sacramental Preparation) and Advent/Christmas (Gift). The children will be learning about Jesus's human family and God's gift of love and friendship. In Year 4, we will be looking to John 4: 9 for inspiration "God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him."

Mrs Peacock will be teaching this subject.

Mathematics

In Maths, children will develop and build upon skills from Y3. We will consolidate our existing understanding of place value up to 4 digits. We will also be learning formal written methods for both addition and subtraction, before focusing on new written methods to calculate multiplication and division. We will be striving to learn our times tables especially as the curriculum states that by end of Year 4 children should know up to and including the twelve times table! If you could spare any time at home to support and encourage your child to learn their times tables this would be greatly appreciated. Times Table Rock star is great for this!

Science

The Science topics to be covered this term are 'States of Matter" and 'Sound'. We will be exploring solids, liquids and gases and also investigating sound, covering vibrations, soundproofing, pitch and loudness.

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
P.E.

Home learning

Children will receive a homework menu which includes a variety of activities. Children are required to choose and complete three activities before half term. The homework menu also includes weekly spellings to practise at home which will be tested on a Thursday afternoon. The children will be bringing home a book suitable for their reading level as part of their structured reading. Please encourage your child to read this at home. Alongside this, the children will also bring home a reading record book. Children are expected to bring their reading book and record into school every day with a date and comment to show that they have read.
